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1. Invitation

1.1 The City of Jackson, Mississippi is soliciting sealed bids from qualified contractors to provide grass cutting and vegetation management services along major thoroughfares within the City limits. This procurement may result in multiple awards by Ward. The City of Jackson is divided into seven (7) Wards. The work

under this IFB is separated into seven (7) bids by Wards. Contractors may bid one, multiple, or all Wards. Awards may be made by individual Wards.

2. Scope of Work and Requirements

2.1. Description of Services

Services include routine grass cutting, trimming, and vegetation control along City-maintained major thoroughfares, including medians, shoulders, slopes, embankments, and intersections. Highways, and non-City maintained roads are excluded.

1. Mowing, trimming/weed eating, and edging turf and lawn areas, sidewalks, and walking paths:
 - Mowing: Cutting the grass to a specified height.
 - Trimming/Weed eating: Using a string trimmer to cut grass and weeds in areas that are difficult to reach with a mower, such as around obstacles or along edges.
 - Edging: Creating a clean line between the lawn and hard surfaces like sidewalks or driveways.
2. General site cleanup, removal of litter and debris:
 - Site cleanup: Removal of cut grass, leaves, branches, and other debris from the lawn and landscaped areas.
 - Removal of litter and debris: Ensuring that all trash, litter, and other unwanted items are collected and disposed of properly.

2.2. Right-of-Way Maintenance Tasks

Maintenance cycles and schedule - A cycle is defined as the activities necessary to perform a particular maintenance task one (1) time.

1. **The maintenance cycle for rights-of-way will be bi-weekly during the months of April through October. During the remaining months of the year (January through March, and November through December), the maintenance cycle will be three weeks (once per month).** The contractor may be instructed to mow more frequently in faster growing months and less in slower growing months.
2. Litter and debris removal shall correspond with mowing cycles. Litter and debris shall be collected before and after each mowing. Where more frequent mowing is required or directed, litter pickup and debris shall be completed along with each mowing.
3. The Contractor shall provide the City a schedule of what days, where and how many crews are mowing grass. The Contractor shall keep the schedule accurate and up to date.

4. All mowing, edging and litter/debris removal under these contracts shall be performed on the contracts (sites) and continue until the cycle is complete.
5. Contractors shall work Monday through Friday with a minimum of forty (40) hours per week per Ward awarded. Weekends can be scheduled with advance notice to the City.

2.3. Equipment

1. All equipment utilized in the performance of this contract must be furnished by the mowing contractor and shall be safe and in good mechanical safe condition. Contractor must provide zero-turn mowers, weed-eaters, and tractors equipped with batwing mowing attachments. All equipment shall meet minimum OSHA standards. Contractor must demonstrate the ability to deploy multiple crews simultaneously.
2. All rotary mowers must be equipped with safety shields, chains or guards to prevent damage to property by flying debris from under mower. Engines must be equipped with manufacturer approved mufflers to reduce noise emission.
3. All equipment shall be kept in good operating condition and shall be maintained to provide a clean, sharp cut of the vegetation at all times.
4. Lawn-edgers may be rigid or flexible blade type that will produce a fine clean edge.
5. Disinfecting of equipment: All mowing and edging equipment shall be disinfected before commencing work at any site under this contract if diseased plants have been cut or trimmed with that equipment within 3 days of entering the site. Disinfectant shall be 1 part of fresh bleach to 9 parts of clean tap water, applied by spraying to the blade(s) and underside of cutting decks and/or all pruning tools.
6. Contractor shall provide at his expense such personal safety equipment for all personnel working at each site that complies with the applicable OSHA safety standards for the maintenance activity. This shall include but not be limited to eye, ear, skin and head protection. All workers shall be provided with high visibility safety apparel meeting the Performance Class 2 or 3 requirements of ANSI/ISEA 107-2004, "American National Standard for High-Visibility Safety Apparel and Headwear", in accordance with regulations for workers on Federal Aid Highways.

2.4. Mowing, Lawn and Turf Maintenance

1. All areas within the project limits shall be mowed during each cycle and on continuous days, save and except for Sundays and days of inclement weather. All streets included in this contract shall be cut in their entirety.

Partial cutting of segments will not be permitted. The City of Jackson shall determine and define the right-of-way boundaries and limits of maintenance for each street. The Contractor shall perform mowing and vegetation management within all boundaries as designated by the City.

2. The Contractor shall mow as close as practical to all fences, curbs, walls or buildings where applicable. Any vegetation unable to be cut by mechanical means must be cut by other means to a height of 2 inches or at height determined by City Project Manager. All streets must be cut in it's
3. Contractor shall mow and maintain grass and vegetation within the public right-of-way up to **twenty-five (25) feet from the edge of pavement or back of curb**, where accessible and safe. **(This does NOT apply to Hwy 18, Hwy 49/Medgar Evers, Hwy 80, & Green Spaces)**

3a. Exclusions

1. Highway medians, frontage roads, interstate corridors, and state maintained rights-of-way are excluded unless explicitly stated.
2. Drainage ditches, steep slopes, and inaccessible terrain shall be excluded unless separately authorized by the City.

3b. Special Conditions

1. The City reserves the right to require expanded cutting widths at intersections, curves, and sight-distance-critical locations as needed for safety.
2. Any such expanded area shall be identified in advance or directed in writing by the City's Contract Manager.
4. Use string trimmers to cut grass in areas inaccessible to mowers. Do NOT use string trimmers to expose sprinkler heads. Areas include, but are not limited to light poles, fencing, signs, trash receptacles, benches, tree rings, culverts, ditches, canal edges, and ramps.
5. Mechanically edge grass along or around all walkways, curbs, ramps, embankments, obstructions and landscaped beds. Edging shall be completed with stick edgers or edging machines. Weed-eaters are not permitted in lieu of stick or machine edgers—where required. Edging shall be completed in full every cycle.
6. String trimmers are NOT to be used within 12" of the tree or shrub trunks.
7. Grass shall be cut at a uniform height of 2 inches or at height determined by City Project Manager. All equipment must be set at the same height in order to produce an even cut and appearance.

8. All grass clippings shall be mulched. No "wads" or piles of grass clippings will be allowed to remain on the lawn or turf after mowing operations. Any piles of grass clippings that could not be mulched with mower shall be removed from site by the Contractor, at Contractor's expense.
9. All grass clippings, dirt, dust and any other debris must be removed from all plant beds, sidewalks, ramps, driveways, parking lots, curbs, tree mulch rings, streets, and trails after each mowing. Power blowers, vacuums and sweepers are permitted.
10. Special care shall be taken to prevent clippings and debris from being directed into irrigation canals, storm water detention areas, streets, gutters or storm sewer inlets.
11. Mowing will not be permitted when, in the opinion of the City, the soil and/or weather conditions are such that property could be damaged. The Contractor, at his/her own expense, shall immediately repair any such damage or rutting.
12. Uneven cuts, scalping, and varying heights of lawn areas will be considered unsatisfactory to City standards. The Contractor will be given one written notice for each occurrence. If the problem reoccurs in the same location(s), the City shall deduct \$100 for each occurrence from the amount due the Contractor in order to offset the cost to the City to correct unsatisfactory work.

2.5. Litter and Debris Removal

1. All litter and debris must be collected, removed and disposed of properly from the project sites during each cycle/visit.
2. Litter and debris shall be picked up prior to each mowing cycle and then immediately following the actual mowing and trimming. This is to retrieve any litter missed the first time and cut into smaller pieces by the mower.
3. Litter and debris shall be disposed of properly, off site, at the Contractor's expense.
4. Litter and debris shall be defined as any object not intentionally placed at the project sites for a specific purpose. This shall include but not be limited to paper, wrappers, cans, bottles, building material, disposable diapers and cigarette butts found on the grounds.

2.6. Special Conditions

1. Contractor shall advise the City by telephone, immediately upon discovery and in written form within 24 hours, of any obvious irrigation problems. This shall include, but not be limited to, broken sprinkler heads, leaks, breaks, wet spots, missing valve box covers and dry spots.

2. Contractor shall notify the City of any plant problems such as leaf drop, discoloration, insect infestation and death, in written form within 24 hours of discovery.
3. Contractor shall be able to provide services for Special Events within 24 hours of request. These requests may substitute for regularly scheduled cycles or may be in addition to regular cycles, solely at the discretion of the City.
4. Periodic inspections will be made by the City to determine the quality of the work being performed.
5. City will notify Contractor as soon as possible of any Special Events, such as outdoor festivals, etc., that may affect elements of the Grounds Maintenance Contract. Contractor shall adjust work schedules as necessary.

2.7. Safety and Damage

1. If traffic or pedestrian levels are such that mowing the area will impede traffic or endanger the public in any way, work must cease until such time as those factors causing cessation of work have abated. If the Contractor fails to cease work on his/her own judgment, the City shall have the right to halt the Contractor's work.
2. In order to ensure safety to the public, the Contractor shall take adequate safety precautions. He shall coordinate all work with the City and shall place warning signs in accordance with the State of Mississippi Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, where applicable.
3. Signs, sign stands and safety flags as may be required to protect the public shall be furnished by the Contractor. The Contractor shall be responsible for maintenance, repairs and/or replacement of all signs and safety devices as necessary or as required by the City.
4. The Contractor will confine all operations to weekday, daylight hours, unless otherwise authorized by the City.
5. The Contractor shall exercise care so as to avoid damage to trees, shrubs, sprinklers, utilities and other amenities within the project site. Damage must be corrected or repaired by the Contractor, at his/her expense, or may be performed by the City and the costs for such repairs deducted from payment. All repairs must be completed within five (5) days from date of damage.

2.8. Neglect and Vandalism

1. Turf, shrubs, trees or other plants that are damaged or killed due to Contractor's operations, negligence or application of pesticides shall be replaced by the Contractor, at no expense to the City.
2. Sprinklers or irrigation equipment, or other structures that are damaged by the Contractor's operations must be replaced by the Contractor promptly, with like materials.
3. All water damage, either natural or man-made; resulting from Contractor's neglect shall be corrected at the Contractor's expense.
4. All damage to landscaping, hardscaping and/or irrigation system due to thefts or vandalism, not caused or allowed by the Contractor shall be corrected by the Contractor at the City's expense, upon written authorization to proceed.
5. All damage to windows, windshields, or other such damage to buildings, equipment or vehicles on the site caused by Contractor shall be promptly corrected at the Contractor's expense.
6. The Contractor shall answer emergency or complaint calls within two (2) hours and corrective action shall be complete within eight (8) hours.

2.9. Site Conditions

The Contractor shall become familiar with each site and condition of all plant materials. He should know the location of all irrigation meters and valves so that irrigation systems can be turned off, if and when damage occurs. The Contractor shall notify the City, in writing, at the beginning of the contract, of any conditions that do not meet the intended standards of care as outlined in these specifications.

2.10. General

1. Under the terms of this agreement, the Contractor shall not, in the conduct of their business and in the process of employment, payment of salaries, assignments, discipline, or termination, harass, intimidate, or discriminate against employees or prospective employees by reason of race, color, national origin, religion, sex, age, disability, sexual orientation or veteran's status.
2. The Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, rules, regulations, and orders of all authorities having jurisdiction over the contract. The contractor cannot hire individuals for this project who are currently employed by the City of Jackson.

3. Contractor agrees that all subcontractors performing work under this agreement shall comply with its provisions and it is expressly understood that all persons employed by the Contractor, either directly or indirectly, shall be considered employees of the Contractor and not employees of the City. The Contractor shall notify the City when and where subcontractors will be used at the time their proposal is submitted.
4. The City reserves the right to inspect and audit at its expense, the financial records and support documents of the Contractor or any subcontractor(s) hired by the Contractor relative to any work paid for or reimbursed under this contract.
5. This contract may not be assigned without the express written consent of the City.

2.11. Bond

The Contractor, simultaneously with the execution of the contract, will be required to furnish a performance bond in an amount equal to thirty (30) percent of the total contract price. The bond is to be held by the City for the duration of the contract. The premium for the bond shall be paid for by the Contractor. The surety of the bond shall be a duly authorized corporate surety authorized to do business in the State of Mississippi. Attorneys-in-fact who sign the bonds must file with each bond, a certified and effectively dated copy of their Power of Attorney.

2.12. Inspection and Payment

1. Upon completion of the entire maintenance cycle of each site, the Contractor shall notify the City that all work is complete and ready for final inspection. The City shall inspect all work within three (3) working days and notify the Contractor in writing or verbally of the acceptance or rejection of the work. Any work rejected must be completed within five (5) working days and prior to submittal of payment request to the City.
2. The Contractor's performance will be evaluated for each cycle. In the event the performance is unsatisfactory and the poor performance is clearly the fault of the Contractor (any service not performed that is required by the contract), the Contractor will be given written notice stating the deficient area(s), a date by which the deficiencies must be completed, and the amount of money being withheld until deficiency is corrected and satisfactory to the City. Partial payment shall be allowed only when unforeseen, unavoidable circumstances, in the opinion of the City, render a complete mowing or landscape bed maintenance impractical. This partial payment will be based on the percent of mowing or and maintenance actually completed as determined by the City.

2.13. Award Terms

3. Submission Instructions

3.1. Format

1. You are required to send one (1) original and three (3) copies of all information being submitted. You are also required to sign your documents. This includes your bid form and any information you submit with your bid (research data sheets, booklets, pamphlets, etc.), or your bid may be considered non-responsive. Your bottom-line bid price must be submitted on the form provided by the City in the Appendix section. If more than one complete bid is submitted per a delivery envelope, it will not be accepted as an official bid.
2. The complete bid pricing section must be returned if you submit a bid and any required/mandatory documents (example: bids having more than one bid section, parts, pages, or a checklist).
3. The instruction and specification sections should not be returned with your bid proposal forms. They are yours to keep.
4. Proposal forms must be legibly handwritten or typed. If not, they will be considered non-responsive. Errors or corrections must be crossed out and changes must be printed in ink or typewritten. All changes must be initialed in ink by the person signing the bid.
5. The unit price will always govern in determining the extended price or the total price. Therefore, please review your price carefully before submitting your bid. No bid shall be altered or amended after the specified time for bid opening or once delivered.
6. Do not submit prices for more than one product, or the same product per item. This means only one product, one size, and price per bid form as specified in the package.
7. Alternate bids are not acceptable unless submitted in a separate, sealed routing envelope and in no way concealed in a delivery envelope. Alternate bids may be submitted, but will not necessarily be accepted by the City. The City reserves the right to determine whether an alternative being offered is equivalent to and meets the standards and specifications. All

bids submitted must be on the bid proposal forms furnished by the City or copies thereof. Otherwise, it will not be considered.

8. Any bid received with limiting or conditional requirements will automatically be deemed non-responsive (example: all or none; all items must be ordered at the same time, specified amount to be ordered, no notation or other packaging pricing below the submitted price).
9. Facsimile-transmitted proposals or other documents are not acceptable.
10. All one-time awards must be valid for a minimum of 90 days from the bid opening date. All term bids must be valid for the duration of the terms defined in the proposal for each bid. Vendors may not withdraw a bid prior to the end of 90 days, or the stated terms of said bid. Vendors who do not comply with this requirement shall be considered non-responsive.

3.2. Bid Submission Instructions

1. Vendors responding to this Invitation for Bid (IFB) shall submit their bids in either physical hardcopy or electronic form. All bids (both electronic and physical hard copies) **MUST** be received no later than 3:30 PM Central Standard Time, **on March 24, 2026**.

If the bid contains confidential or trade information, one (1) additional confidential or trade electronic copy of the complete bid, including all attachments shall be submitted in a searchable format, preferably in Microsoft Word® or Portable Document Format (PDF), shall be labeled CONFIDENTIAL, and shall redact the confidential or trade information only.

4. Selection Criteria

- 4.1. Bid openings will be conducted and open to the public. However, note, they will serve only for the opening, and reading of the price in no way determines an award.
- 4.2. The award will be made to the lowest and best bidder based on the criteria in this Invitation for Bid.

5. Terms and Conditions

ALL VENDORS ARE URGED TO READ AND UNDERSTAND THESE TERMS AND CONDITIONS PRIOR TO SUBMITTING A BID.

5.1. Disclaimer

The City and its advisors have, to the best of their knowledge, represented information and data that are current and applicable to this IFB. The City is providing the information contained herein as a courtesy to the Offerors. The City and its advisors neither guarantee nor warranty that the information contained in this IFB or referenced documents is accurate and complete. The City and its advisors are not and will not be liable for omissions or errors contained in this IFB. It is the Service Offeror's responsibility to use this information and verify the same during the proposal, negotiation, and contract implementation periods through its own due diligence.

5.2. Confidentiality

The contents of responses/proposals to this IFB shall not be discussed or shared outside the submittal process with any other Offerors and/or potential Offerors regarding the services to be offered or fees associated with the operation or implementation of the services described in this IFB. Any violation of this Section shall result in the immediate disqualification of the offending Offeror's proposal.

5.3. Proposal Guidelines and Instructions

1. **Errors in Bids:** The City will not be liable for any errors in Bids. Bids may be rejected as unresponsive if they are incomplete, are missing pages or information, or cannot be opened for any reason. The City may waive minor irregularities and request Offeror(s) cure such irregularity, but such waiver will not modify any remaining IFB requirements. A minor irregularity means that the defect is immaterial or inconsequential as to price, quantity, quality, or delivery when contrasted with the total costs or scope of the services being provided.

2. **Bid Withdrawal Procedure:** Bids may be withdrawn up until the Submission Date. Any bid not so withdrawn shall, upon opening, constitute an irrevocable offer for a period of ninety (90) days to provide the services set forth in the bids or until one of the bids has been accepted and an agreement has been executed between the City and the successful Offeror.
3. **Proposer Certifications:** By submitting a Bid, each Offeror certifies under penalty of perjury that:
 - a. Its submission is not the result of collusion or any other activity that would tend to influence the selection process directly or indirectly; and
 - b. The Offeror is able or will be able to comply with all requirements of this solicitation at the time of contract award; and
 - c. Offeror certifies all statements in the response are true; and
 - d. Neither Offeror, its employees, nor any affiliated firm providing the requested goods and services has any actual or potential conflict of interest with any City officers or employees relating to this solicitation.
4. **Estimated Quantities:** If the solicitation results in an indefinite quantity, the goods and services requested by the City may be less than the maximum value of the Agreement and there is no guarantee, either expressed or implied, as to the actual quantity of goods and services that will be authorized under the Agreement.
5. **No Commitment:** Neither the submission of a Bid nor the City's receipt of Bid materials confers any right to the Offeror nor any obligation on the City. This IFB does not commit the City to award a contract, nor will the City defray any costs incurred in preparing Bids or participating in any presentations or negotiations.
6. **Reservation of the Rights of the City:** The award of this project is subject to the availability of funding. The City reserves the right to request clarification of information submitted and to request additional information from one (1) or more Offerors. The City of Jackson reserves the right to reject all Bids where the Offeror takes exception to the terms and conditions of the IFB and/or fails to meet the terms and conditions and/or in any way attempts to limit the rights of the City of Jackson in any required contractual term(s) and provision(s) set forth in this IFB.

The City of Jackson reserves the right to amend the contents of this IFB by Addendum as it deems necessary. It is the responding Service Provider's/Offeror's sole responsibility to monitor the City of Jackson's website for amendments to this IFB to ensure that their response is pursuant to the amended IFB, if applicable.

The City reserves the right to negotiate with the next lowest qualified Offeror if the first choice does not agree to terms. The City reserves the right to negotiate all elements of work that comprise the selected proposal.

The City reserves the right, after opening the Bids, or at any other point during the selection process, to reject any or all Bids, modify or postpone the proposed project, evaluate any alternatives offered, or accept the proposal that, in the City's sole judgment, is in its best interests.

The City reserves the right to terminate the Contract if the selected Offeror fails to begin to perform the work described herein within ten (10) days after the City gives the selected Offeror a written notice to proceed.

7. **Selection:** At any time in the evaluation process, the City may request clarifications from Offerors.
8. **Determination of Responsiveness:** A responsive proposal conforms to the instructions set forth in this solicitation and any modifications to it. Non-responsive proposals will be rejected. The City, in its sole discretion, may waive nonconsequential deviations if the deviations cannot have provided an advantage over other Offerors.
9. **Determination of Responsibility:** The City will make a determination of the responsibility of any Offeror under consideration for award, taking into consideration matters such as the Offeror's compliance with public policy and laws, past performance, fiscal responsibility, financial and technical resources, capacity, and experience to satisfactorily carry out its responsibilities. The City will notify any Offeror in writing what was found non-responsive and allow the finding to be contested.

5.4. Contract Award

1. **Contract Negotiations:** The City reserves the right to award contracts by individual Ward, to multiple contractors, or to a single contractor. The City further reserves the right to reject any and all bids. Once a decision has been made to award a contract to one or more Offerors, the City will post a Notice of Intent to Award. Contract negotiations are neither an offer nor an implicit guarantee that a contract will be awarded. The award, if made, will be to the responsive, responsible Offeror offering the lowest and best bid to the City for the services described in this solicitation.
2. Work is not authorized until award by City Council.
3. After the contract has been awarded by the City Council, the City will issue a Notice to Proceed to Offeror and performance may proceed. Prior to contract award, no City employee may authorize work. Any work performed prior to that time may be uncompensated.

5.5. Protests

1. Protests that do not comply with the protest procedures outlined below will be rejected.

2. Protest Format, Eligibility and Address:

- a. Protests or objections may be filed regarding the contract award.
 - b. The City will only review protests submitted by an interested party, defined as an actual or prospective offeror whose direct economic interest could be affected by the City's conduct of the solicitation.
 - c. Submit protests to the City via email to Lakesha Weathers, Solid Waste Manager, Department of Public Works at lweathers@jacksonms.gov.
 - d. Issues related to the protest will be reviewed by the Office of the City Attorney.
- 3. Protest Deadlines:** Submit protests of the contract award within 10 days of acceptance of the bid. The date of filing is the date the City receives the protest unless received after 5 p.m. CST, or on any day other than a Business Day, in which case, the date of filing will be the next Business Day.

FAILURE TO FILE BY THE RELEVANT DEADLINE CONSTITUTES A WAIVER OF ANY PROTEST ON THOSE GROUNDS. SUPPLEMENTAL MATERIALS FILED AFTER THE RELEVANT DEADLINE SHALL BE REJECTED BY THE CITY.

- 4. Protest Contents:** The letter of protest must include all the following elements:
- a. Detailed grounds for the protest, fully supported with technical data, test results, documentary evidence, names of witnesses, and other pertinent information related to the subject being protested; and
 - b. The law, rule, regulation, ordinance, provision, or policy upon which the protest is based, with an explanation of the violation.
- 5. Reply to Protest:** The City will send a written response to the protesting party and to any other party named in the protest within a reasonable time.
- 6. No Stay of Procurement Action During Protest:** Nothing in these protest requirements will prevent the City from proceeding with negotiations or awarding a contract while a protest is pending.

5.6. Public Records

1. Generally

- a. All bids, protests, and information submitted in response to this solicitation will become the property of the City and will be considered public records. As such, they may be subject to public review.
- b. Any contract arising from this IFB will be a public record.
- c. Submission of any materials in response to this IFB constitutes:

- i. Consent to the City's release of such materials under the Public Records Act without notice to the person or entity submitting the materials; and
- ii. Waiver of all claims against the City and/or its officers, agents, or employees that the City has violated an Offeror's right to privacy, disclosed trade secrets, or caused any damage by allowing the bid or materials to be inspected; and
- iii. Agreement to indemnify and hold harmless the City for release of such information under the Public Records Act; and
- iv. Acknowledgement that the City will not assert any privileges that may exist on behalf of the person or entity submitting the materials.

2. Confidential Information

- a. The City is not seeking proprietary information and will not assert any privileges that may exist on behalf of the Offeror. Offerors are responsible for asserting any applicable privileges or reasons why a document should not be produced in response to a public record request.
- b. If submitting information protected from disclosure as a trade secret or any other basis, identify each page of such material subject to protection as "CONFIDENTIAL." If the requested material has been designated as confidential, the City will attempt to inform the Offeror of the public records request in a timely manner to permit assertion of any applicable privileges.
- c. Failure to seek a court order protecting information from disclosure within ten days of the City's notice of a request to the Offeror will be deemed agreement to disclosure of the information and the Offeror agrees to indemnify and hold the City harmless for release of such information.
- d. Requests to treat an entire bid as confidential will be rejected. Any such request will be deemed an agreement to the City for disclosure of the entire bid. In such an event, the Offeror agrees to indemnify and hold the City harmless for release of any information requested.
- e. Trade secrets will only be considered confidential if claimed to be a trade secret when submitted to the City, marked as confidential, and compliant with state and federal rules and regulations.

5.7. Special Provisions (By submitting a bid, the Service Provide agrees to be bond by these provisions, if awarded a bid)

1. **OSHA Compliance:** The Offeror agrees to comply with conditions of the Federal Occupational Safety and Health Acts of 1970 (OSHA), as may be amended, and the standards and regulations issued there under and certifies that all services under this Contract will conform to and comply with

said standards and regulations. The Service Provider further agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the City from all damages assessed against the City because of the Service Provider's failure to comply with the acts and standards there under and for the failure of the services furnished under this Contract to so comply.

2. **Mississippi Employment Protection Act:** Service Provider shall comply with the provisions of the Mississippi Employment Protection Act, Miss. Code § 71-11-3 (1972, as amended) in the hiring of personnel.
3. **Audit:** The Service Provider shall maintain full and complete accounting records, prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, reflecting the Service Provider's work on this Contract. The City may require an audit of such books and records at any reasonable time. Such audit will be conducted by City staff or by a certified public accounting firm with experience in auditing public service companies selected by the City.

Upon request, the Service Provider shall permit the City to inspect and audit all pertinent books and records of the Service Provider, any subcontractor, or any other person or entity that performed work in connection with or related to this Contract, at all times deemed necessary by the City, including up to six years after the final payment or release of withheld amounts has been made under this Contract. Such inspection and audit shall occur in the City of Jackson or other such reasonable location as the City selects. The Service Provider shall supply the City with, or shall permit the City to make, a copy of any books and records and any portion thereof. The Service Provider shall ensure that such inspection, audit, and copying right of the City is a condition of any subcontract, agreement, or other arrangement under which any other person or entity is permitted to perform work under this Contract.

4. **Contract Rights:** The parties reserve the right to amend the resulting contract from time to time by mutual agreement in writing. Rights under the resulting contract are cumulative and in addition to rights existing at common law. Payment by the City and performance by the Service Provider do not waive their contractual rights.

Failure by either party on any occasion to exercise a contractual right shall not forfeit or waive the right to exercise the right on another occasion. The use of one remedy does not exclude or waive the right to use another.

5. **Interpretation:** The IFB and any resulting contract shall be interpreted as a whole and to carry out its purposes. The IFB and any resulting contract are integrated documents and contain all the promises of the parties; no earlier oral understandings modify its provisions. No oral promises, oral obligations, or oral agreements whatsoever, made at any time, shall become a part of the this IFB and any resulting contract.

6. **Law and Venue:** The laws of the State of Mississippi and Ordinances of the City shall govern the validity, construction, and effect of this IFB and any resulting contract. The venue for any claims, litigation, or causes of action between the parties shall be in a court of appropriate jurisdiction of the State of Mississippi for the First Judicial District of Hinds County.
7. **Notices:** All official notices or approvals shall be in writing. Unless otherwise directed, notices shall be delivered by messenger or by certified or registered mail (return receipt requested) to the parties at the following respective addresses (Service Provider, please provide the City with a designated contact person):

Either party may from time to time designate a new address for notices. Unless a return receipt or other document establishes otherwise, a notice sent by U.S. Mail shall be presumed to be received the second business day after its mailing.

8. **Severability:** Should any term, provision, condition, or other portion of the IFB and any contract resulting therefrom or its application be held to be inoperative, invalid, or unenforceable, and the remainder of this IFB and the resulting contract still fulfills its purposes, the remainder of this IFB and the resulting contract shall not be affected thereby and shall continue in force and effect.
9. **No Personal Liability:** No officer, agent, or authorized employee of the City shall be personally responsible for any liability arising under this IFB or the resulting contract, whether expressed or implied, nor for any statement or representation made herein or in any connection with this IFB or any resulting contract.
10. **Disputes:** The parties to the resulting contract agree to engage in good faith negotiations to resolve any disputes. If the parties are unable to resolve their dispute, either party may litigate the dispute in a court of competent jurisdiction in the First Judicial District of Hinds County, Mississippi. The applicable law for determining the rights of the parties shall be the laws of Mississippi.

11. **Termination for Convenience:** The City may terminate the resulting contract at any time by giving written notice to the Service Provider of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, at least thirty (30) days before the effective date of such termination.

The resulting contract may be terminated in whole or in part by the City upon written notice to Service Provider, if Service Provider should become the subject of bankruptcy or receivership proceedings, whether voluntary or involuntary, or upon the execution by Service Provider of an assignment for the benefit of its creditors. In the event of such termination, Service Provider shall be entitled to recover just and equitable compensation for satisfactory work performed under the resulting contract, but in no case shall said compensation exceed the total contract price.

12. **Termination for Default:** If the Service Provider refuses or fails to perform any of the provisions of the resulting contract with such diligence as will ensure its completion within the time specified in this IFB, the resulting contract, or any extension thereof, or otherwise fails to timely satisfy the provisions of the resulting contract, or commits any other substantial breach of the resulting contract, the City of Jackson or designee may notify the Service Provider in writing of the delay or nonperformance and if not cured in ten (10) days or any longer time specified in writing by the City of Jackson or designee, the City of Jackson may terminate the Service Provider's right to proceed with the resulting contract or such part of the resulting contract as to which there has been delay or a failure to properly perform. In the event of termination in whole or in part, the City of Jackson or designee may procure similar supplies or services in a manner and upon terms deemed appropriate by the City of Jackson. The Service Provider shall continue performance of the resulting contract to the extent it is not terminated and shall be liable for excess costs incurred in procuring similar goods or services.
13. **Vendor's Duties:** Notwithstanding termination of the resulting contract and subject to any directions from the City of Jackson or designee, the Service Provider shall take timely, reasonable, and necessary action to protect and preserve property in the possession of the Service Provider in which the City of Jackson has an interest.
14. **Payment:** Service Provider agrees to accept all payments in United States currency via the City of Jackson's payment and remittance vehicle. The City of Jackson agrees to make in accordance with Mississippi law on "Timely Payments for Purchases by Public Bodies," which generally provides for payment of undisputed amounts by the agency within forty-five (45) days of receipt of invoice. Mississippi Code Annotated § 31-7-301, et seq. All invoices should be submitted to the Solid Waste Division within the Department of Public Works for processing.

Payment for completed services delivered and accepted by the City of Jackson shall be at the contract price. The City of Jackson may withhold

from amounts due Service Provider such sums as the City of Jackson deems to be necessary to protect the City of Jackson against loss because of outstanding liens or claims of lien holders and to reimburse the City of Jackson for the excess costs incurred in procuring similar goods and services.

15. Excuse for Nonperformance or Delayed Performance: Except with respect to defaults of subcontractors, Service Provider shall not be in default by reason of any failure in performance of the resulting contract in accordance with its terms (including any failure by Service Provider to make progress in the prosecution of the work hereunder which endangers such performance) if Service Provider has notified the City of Jackson or designee within 15 days after the cause of the delay and the failure arises out of causes such as: acts of God; acts of the public enemy; acts of the State and any other governmental entity in its sovereign or contractual capacity; fires; floods; epidemics; quarantine restrictions; strikes or other labor disputes; freight embargoes; or unusually severe weather. If the failure to perform is caused by the failure of a subcontractor to perform or to make progress, and if such failure arises out of causes similar to those set forth above, Service Provider shall not be deemed to be in default, unless the services to be furnished by the subcontractor were reasonably obtainable from other sources in sufficient time to permit Vendor to meet the contract requirements. In such a case, the City of Jackson may, upon the request of the Vendor, revise the delivery schedule accordingly.

a. **Erroneous Termination for Default:** If, after notice of termination of Service Provider's right to proceed under the provisions of this clause, it is determined for any reason that the Service Provider was not in default, or that the delay was excusable under the provisions of the prior paragraph (Excuse for Nonperformance or Delayed Performance), the rights and obligations of the parties shall be the same as if the notice of termination had been one of termination for convenience.

b. **Additional Rights and Remedies:** The rights and remedies provided in the IFB are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law or under the resulting contract.

16. Termination Upon Bankruptcy

The resulting contract may be terminated in whole or in part by the City of Jackson upon written notice to the Service Provider, if Service Provider should become the subject of bankruptcy or receivership proceedings, whether voluntary or involuntary, or upon the execution by Service Provider of an assignment for the benefit of its creditors. In the event of such termination, Service Provider shall be entitled to recover just and equitable compensation for satisfactory work performed under the resulting contract, but in no case shall said compensation exceed the total contract price.

17. **Approval**

It is understood that the City Council awards the resulting contract and if the bid is not awarded by the City Council, the bid is void and no payment shall be made hereunder.

18. **Successors**

The resulting contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties and their heirs, successors, executors, administrators, legal representatives and permitted assigns, except that successors in elected office are not bound by the actions of their predecessors, including entering into the resulting contract. Consequently, with respect to successors of City Council members and the Mayor, upon their election and thereafter at any time, they may elect to terminate the resulting contract by a vote of the majority of the quorum of the City Council, otherwise the resulting contract shall continue in effect.

19. **Availability of Funds**

It is expressly understood and agreed that the obligation of the City of Jackson to proceed under the resulting contract is conditioned upon the appropriation of funds by the City Council and the receipt of such funds. If the funds anticipated for the continuing fulfillment of the Agreement are, at any time, not forthcoming or insufficient, either through the failure of the City of Jackson to provide funds or of the City Council to appropriate funds or the discontinuance or material alteration of the program under which funds were provided or if funds are not otherwise available to the City of Jackson, the City shall have the right upon ten (10) working days written notice to the Service Provider to terminate the resulting contract without damage, penalty, cost or expenses to the City of any kind whatsoever, other than payment for services rendered prior to receiving written notice. The effective date of termination shall be as specified in the notice of termination.

5.8. Insurance and Indemnity

1. **Insurance:** The Service Provider shall secure, pay the premiums for, and keep in force until the expiration of the resulting contract, liability insurance covering all damage to life and property due to its activities or those of its agents or employees, in connection with its performance under this contract, including operation of equipment and vehicles. This insurance shall include the following coverage and minimum limits:
 - a. **Comprehensive General Liability:** \$1,000,000.00 single limit for each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage combined.
 - b. **Excess Liability:** \$3,000,000.00.
 - c. **Automotive Liability:** \$1,000,000.00 single limit for each occurrence for bodily injury and property damage combined.

- d. **Workers Compensation Insurance** covering all the Service Provider's employees who engage in any work under the contract, as may be required by the laws of the State of Mississippi.
2. **Indemnity:** To the extent permitted by law, the Service Provider shall protect, defend, indemnify and hold the City harmless from and against all claims, demands, damages, costs, actions and causes of actions, liabilities, fines, penalties, judgments, expenses and attorney fees, resulting from the injury or death of any person or the damage to or destruction of property, or the infringement of any patent, copyright, or trademark, or trade secret arising out of the work performed and costs of every kind and nature whatsoever as a result of the negligence or willful misconduct or breach by the Service Provider, to the extent the loss was not otherwise contributed to by the act or negligence of the City including court costs and attorney's fees, arising out of or caused by the Service Provider and its employees, agents, officers, contractors, and/or subcontractors provided under the resulting contract, or the Service Provider's violation of any law, ordinance or regulation, contract provision or term, or condition of regulatory authorization or permit, except for damages resulting from the sole gross negligence of the City.

5.9. Employee Bidding

Bidding by City employees is prohibited. It is hereby declared unlawful for any City official to bid on, sell, or offer for sale, any merchandise services, equipment or material, or similar commodity to the City of Jackson during the tenure of his or her employment, or for the period prescribed by law thereafter, or to have any interest in the selling of the same to the City of Jackson. (§ 25-4-105) (Miss Code 1972 as amended).

5.10. Taxes

Sales tax and federal excise tax are not to be included in any bid price. The City of Jackson assumes no tax liability.

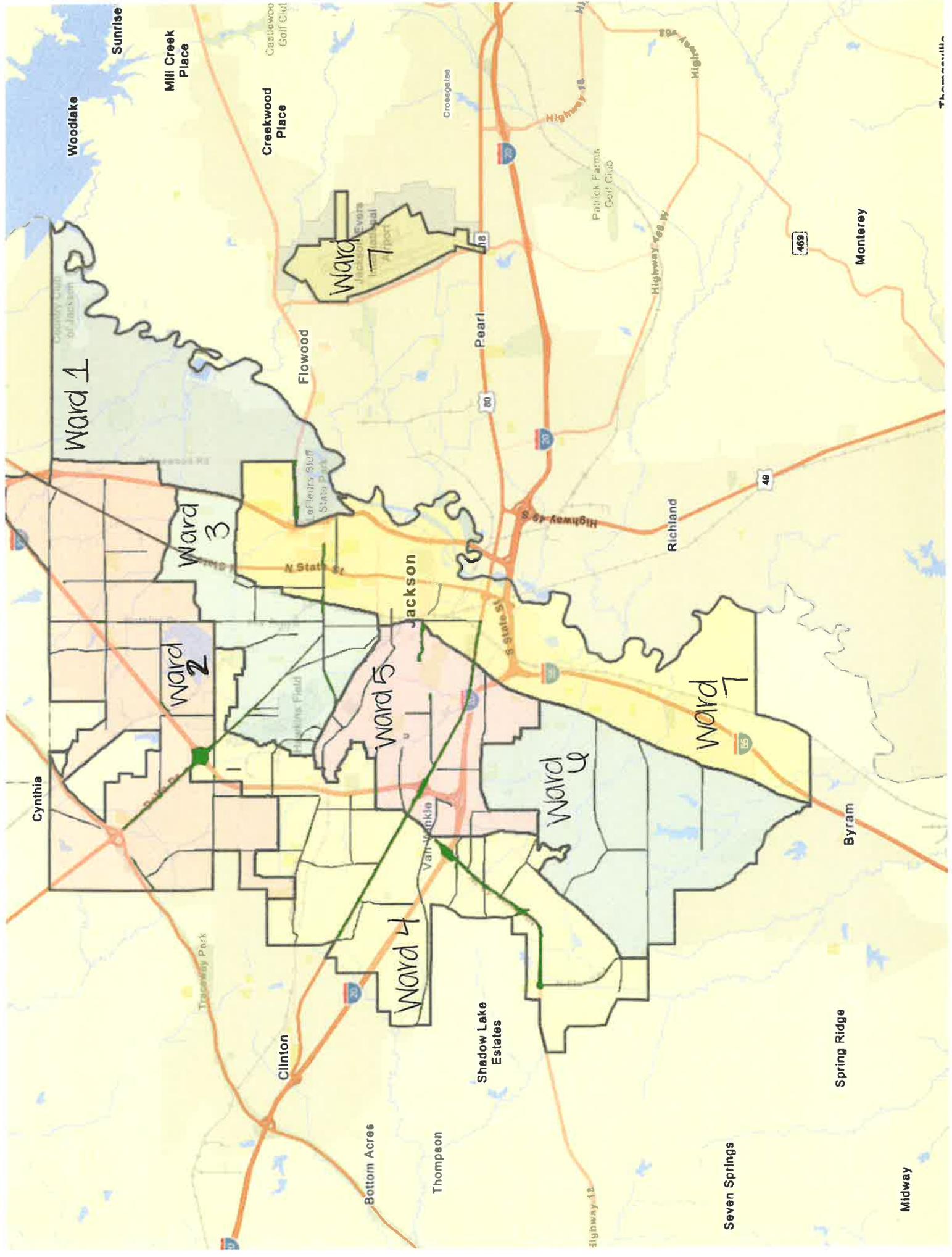
